The 2015 Summer School concentrates on the key aspects of film production, including scriptwriting, producing, directing, cinematography, sound and post production. If you always wanted to know how the professionals do it then now is your chance. Not only will you have access to our state-of-the-art facilities, field trips around the UK, film making workshops and seminars delivered by industry guest speakers, you will also be actively involved in the production of at least one short film, mentored by experts from all areas of film production.

In summary the Summer School will include:

- Field trips to a selection of locations, including the National Film & Television School Beaconsfield, BBC Media City Salford, The Harry Potter Studios London and the set of Coronation Street, a long running British 'soap', in Manchester
- Options to participate in practical workshops including script writing, directing, camera, lighting, sound and editing. All delivered by industry professionals
- Involvement in the production of at least one short film using high-end camera and post-production equipment

- Attending a film screening at the Kinema in the Woods – a small independent cinema in a village on the outskirts of Lincoln that has been open for almost 100 years
- Tours of Lincoln's galleries, museums, the castle and the Cathedral
- A welcome event at the University
- A showing of films and presentation of certificates followed by a farewell gala dinner
- Show reel DVD of Summer School work for you to take away
- A certificate of attendance, presented to all those that complete this year's Film Production Summer School.

The summer school will suit students from a wide variety of backgrounds, who not only want to develop their practical film-making skills but also want to combine this with visits to places of interest throughout the UK that are connected to the film and television industry.

The Summer School tutors include award winning and highly acclaimed academics and practising professionals with backgrounds in major broadcasting and independent film and television companies. Their knowledge and passion for their subject will allow you to learn and be inspired.

Fees

The summer school fee is £1,495 with accommodation and £995 without accommodation. Fees for all students include course materials, use of state of the art filming equipment and facilities, field trips, a welcome event, end of school gala buffet and lunch from Monday to Friday. You must be 18 years or over on the day the summer school starts and all fees need to be paid in full before the summer school starts in July 2015.

Fees do not include flights or visas. Please allow plenty of time to apply for your visa. We can provide invitations if required for this process.

Accommodation

Our Student Village is situated on campus. You will be minutes away from the University's academic buildings, Student Sports Centre and the Engine Shed and the city centre is just a short walk. The accommodation includes a single en-suite room with internet access by university WiFi. There is also a shared self-catering kitchen with crockery, cutlery, utensils, fridge, freezer, cooker and microwave. However, breakfast and lunch will be provided from Monday to Friday for all residential students.
